founded AM/Authentic Models in 1968, working in one of the oldest parts of Amsterdam, a warren of narrow streets, alleys and canals. The Netherlands had lost its South-East Asian colonies decades before. But the call from that nation of innumerable tropical islands, Indonesia, whose nautical history is interwoven with the Dutch East India Company, is embedded in my genes.

I imagined sailing a 16th C. galleon around Cape Horn, past Madagascar, on to the fabled Spice Islands. Cloves and nutmeg were worth their weight in gold back in Europe. Up until that time spices were transported along the Silk Route, taking a year or more to reach Europe.

Sometimes I dropped off my Dad at the old Amsterdam airport before a trip to Batavia (now Jakarta), New York, Cape Town. We drove right onto the platform where he'd climb the stairs to a waiting Dakota DC3 or Lockheed Constellation. No direct, non-stop flights like now... Transit stations could be Budapest, Istanbul, Jodhpur, Rangoon. World travelers then were few. Hand typed lists of co-travelers were handed out before departure.

Years later, I've traveled the globe myself many times. But even now, the scents and impressions of faraway destinations still excite and fascinate.

Dispatched for victuals for the captain's table or to take the crew on shore leave... Gigs were invaluable when in port or moored outside. Referred to as rowboats by land-bound folk, a gig was easy to lower overboard, handled by one sailor, and quick to dispatch. When stowed, it nested inside the long boat secured on the main hatch.
Our lapstrake (overlapping strips of wood) gigs are not seaworthy, but they certainly look like it! Clinker-built, they add flair and atmosphere to any room. Shelves turn them into fun displays and bookcases.


n early British Navy light from the period between WWI and WWII. What we loved most was all the details, like the two handles to point and turn the light beam. On board of a 1920's battle cruiser or navy destroyer it would have been mounted on the bridge. Signal lamps were managed by trained signal men, skilled in transmitting morse code. This was obviously way before the age of the internet... In the period before and during the second World War all factories were modified to the manufacture of war material. Brass and Copper was collected from all available sources and turned into usable war contraptions of the highest possible quality. Enjoy this replica of an old signal lamp, by now dating back close to a century, with all it's 'form follows function' and somewhat idiosyncratic details...




hen a friend of mine decided to move to Berwick-on-Tweed to start a B&B in a 13th C. bastion (with walls 10 feet thick and 22 feet high) he was confronted with the problem of how to flood the walls with the right kind of light. Being a smart and enterprising person, a Navy stock lot of 1930s Half Mile Ray lamps was located. Originally constructed to last a lifetime, he rigged them in series, and to the best of my knowledge they are still working. Our faithful reproduction is mounted on a maple tripod, its angle adjustable with a clever piece of 1930s technology. The overall look is cool, contemporary, and at the same time historically correct.

alling ships were on a 24-hour schedule. A crew divided in three groups worked four-hour shifts, with a couple of two-hour dog-watches in between to break the schedule. Only in extreme conditions when 'all hands' were called on deck, was it four hours on, eight hours off. A 30-minute hourglass placed next to the helmsman was turned each time the sand ran through. At the same time he rang the ships bell. One bell for the first glass, two for the second, up to eight for the last half hour of the watch, the signal for a new shift to begin. A half hour on board was called 'Glass'.

The function of the hourglass before the introduction of the chronometer was to keep track of time, essential for calculating longitude. Sailing from Cape Town east to Australia you really didn't want to end up on the infamous reefs out there. Finding latitude was done with sextants and tables. To define longitude, as parallel to the equator, time had to be measured properly.

This handsome, classic hourglass once ruled the schedule on a French Admiral's command vessel.
